In addition, Professor De Leo has been responsible for the organization of the six seminars/year for the Life Promotion Clinic (Mt Gravatt campus) and the World Suicide Prevention Day (Brisbane) on 10th September of every year until October 2015, plus various courses and seminars for the Slovene Centre for Suicide Research and De Leo Fund.

Together with Prof. Ella Arensman (Ireland) and Prof. Jane Pirkis (Australia), Prof De Leo will be the President and Main Organiser of the next World Congress of the International Association for Suicide Prevention, Gold Coast, Australia, 18-22 September 2021.

International Linkages

A formal cooperation for research and postgraduate courses has been established between the Australian Institute for Suicide Research and Prevention (AISRAP) and the Centre pour la Recherche dans le Suicide et l'Euthanasie (CRISE), Montreal, University of Quebec at Montreal (UQAM). A similar agreement is in operation with the Hong Kong Jockey Club Suicide Research Centre, Hong Kong University. A formal agreement has been established with the Beijing Suicide Research Centre (Peking University) on 3rd November 2004. A Memorandum of Understanding has been signed in 2006 with the SNEHA of Chennai and with VHS Hospitals of India. A formal agreement also exists between AISRAP and the National Public Health Institute of Oslo, Norway (4 June, 2007). Another formal co-operation exists with the Swedish-Estonian Research Institute (2008), with the Fondazione Zancan (Padova, Italy) (2008) and with the University of Padua (2010). In 2012, a twining has been signed between the University of Primorska (Slovenia) and Griffith University.

In July 2005 the Australian Institute for Suicide Research and Prevention has been designated as a **World Health Organisation Collaborating Centre for Research and Training in Suicide Prevention**. The Centre has been re-appointed in 2009 for another four-year term and then again in 2013, and is a partner in the **Research Fellowship Project of WHO** to provide training in mental health and drug abuse to developing countries young researchers.

Under his IASP presidency, Professor De Leo was successful in creating a **World Day for Suicide Prevention,** under the auspices of WHO. For the first time in the history of the United Nations, this has been organised in occasion of the XXII Congress of the International association for Suicide Prevention, in Stockholm, 10th September 2003, and repeated with increasing popularity therein after.

Professor De Leo is also the ideator and initiator of the **WHO/SUPRE-MISS** Project (World Health Organisation/Suicide Prevention-Multisite Intervention Study on Suicide), the first study ever promoted and managed by WHO-Headquarters (Geneva) in suicidology. It involved both developed and developing countries. This study was firstly announced in Brisbane, within a Regional WHO Meeting organised by AISRAP, in 1999. The first results of the study have been presented in a WHO meeting in Brisbane, 30th June-4th July, 2003. This meeting was attended only by developing countries representatives (Brazil, China, Estonia, India, Iran, South Africa, Sri-Lanka, Vietnam), and Australia, which piloted the feasibility of the entire project.

Professor De Leo is also the ideator and initiator of the **WHO/START Study** Project (World Health Organisation/Suicide Trends in At-Risk Territories). The study was announced at WHO/WPRO in Manila on 18th August 2005 and formally inaugurated on 3rd Mrach 2006 in Brisbane, Australia. This study presently involves twenty countries. On September 2012 the study was approved for extension to the six regions of the WHO.

Professor De Leo is the ideator of the Italian Day Against Loneliness, 25 November (Italian Psychogeriatric Association and other associations).

Service for the Community

Prof. De Leo is a Rotarian: he started his service with Interact and Rotaract Memberships in Rovigo, Italy. He is presently a honorary member of the Wishart **Rotary Club** (QLD).

He has been an awarded member of the **Junior Chamber International**, Lom of Padua, for the years 1982-1992. In this context, he has been the ideator of the **Fair of the Historical Cars** (1983), an event that has become of international resonance and is organised on a yearly basis at the Fiera di Padova.

From 1994 to 1997 Prof. De Leo has acted as Advisor in the Board of the Petrarca **Fencing** Team (Padua), an association that generated a number of World and Olympic champions. Because of this liaison and his passion for this sport activity, he organised the logistics concerning the venue in Brisbane of the Italian Fencing Olympic Team in occasion of Sydney 2000.

Prof. De Leo, with the cooperation of all staff members of AISRAP, has promoted the constitution of Community Action for Preventing Suicide (CAPS), an association composed of members of the community who have an interest in pursuing the best practices in suicide prevention.

Professor De Leo has been the President of **ARIA-QLD**, an association that puts together scientists of Italian descent operating in Queensland in all possible domains. The association has been created by the Italian Embassy in order to promote the development of the Italian culture in Australia.

Prof. De Leo has been one of the Australian **Saggi** (=wise), which was also a group of people (n=20) (not all of Italian descent) appointed by the Italian Consulates to promote all sort of initiatives aimed at raising the profile of the Italian community and promoting the Italian culture in Australia.

Prof. De Leo wass a Board Member of **Co.As.It.** (Italian-Australian Welfare Association) for the years 2001-2010. This agency, which receives support mainly from the Italian Government, encourages people of Italian origin to participate equally in Australian community life by providing culturally and linguistically appropriate welfare services. Co.As.It. is aimed to promote and extend the knowledge and learning of the Italian language and culture to the wider Australian society.

On 26 January 2013, Prof. De Leo has been awarded the title of **Officer of the Australia Order (AO)** "in recognition of his distinguished service to

medicine in the field of psychiatry, and for his efforts in developing national and international strategies for suicide prevention".
